


Medication Errors : This month we focused

on "The Third WHO Global

Patient Safety Challenge: Medication Without Harm" and had series of training to cover nursing and pharmacist staff to make them

aware of unsafe medication practices and medication errors which are a leading cause of injury and avoidable harm in health care systems across the world. Errors can occur at different stages of the medication use process i.e. a) Prescribing, b) Requisition, c) Dispensing or d) Administering. Every point in the process of care-giving is vital and contains a certain degree of inherent unsafety. Our focus is to reduce these preventable harms. To start this we are encouraging staff to report these errors by appreciating them for their contribution



Medication errors cost an estimated 42 billion USD annually ~WHO,2017 to give us insight about our grey areas which required to be strengthened so that we learn from our past and prevent future ones.





Medical Cases

Anatomic (Right posterior) hepatectomy for Hepatocellular carcinoma misdiagnosed as liver abscess.

A 66 year old gentleman was referred to GI surgical OPD with a diagnosis of SOL (space occupying lesion)-liver abscess in segment 6 and 7 on ultrasound abdomen. He was admitted and evaluated. Liver function tests and viral markers were negative. A diagnostic aspiration was also attempted elsewhere, which did not reveal any pus. To characterize the lesion and to confirm the diagnosis, a Triphasic CT abdomen(liver) was performed in radiology department of our hospital. Triphasic CT

abdomen involves scanning the liver in arterial, venous and delayed phases at specific time interval, for example, 30, 70 sec and few minutes later to characterize the lesion and arrive at a diagnosis. This technique is essential for



accurate diagnosis of the liver mass. A diagnosis of malignant mass lesion, probably Hepatocellular carcinoma, occupying segment 6 and 7 was made on Triphasic scan based on the typical findings of arterial enhancement and venous washout. Alpha fetoprotein was normal and Chest CT did not reveal any metastasis. After a preoperative risk assessment, surgery was planned(right posterior hepatectomy). Right posterior hepatectomy (sectorectomy) involves anatomical resection of seg 6 and 7 of liver in anatomical plane of right hepatic vein.

The patient tolerated the procedure well, thanks to



the excellent anesthesia team and perioperative management. The inflow control (hepatic artery pedicle and portal vein control) was performed by Glissonian pedicle t e c h n i q u e a n d

parenchymal transection was performed by kellyclysis (no CUSA used).

Postoperatively, unfortunately, he developed right lower zone lobar pneumonia and required readmission to ICU. Due to optimum critical care in the ICU, he gradually recovered. Antibiotics were stepped up and right ICD was placed for pleural

effusion. Once he recovered, he was shifted to ward, where he made a steady recovery and was discharged about 3 weeks later.

Histopathology report revealed the lesion to be well differentiated hepatocellular carcinoma 9x8 cm size with microvascular invasion. He continues to do well 6 months after surgery.



54 year male having the carcinoma of lower rectum operated for Laparoscopic Abdominal Perineal Resection, Without Any Incision Over The Abdomen under the able leadership of Dr. Manubhai Pipalia successfully. Patient was started on oral diet from day 2 onwards. These types of advanced laparoscopic surgeries are now routine in GCS hospital and poor patients are able to avail the benefits of these at very nominal charges.

65 year male operated for whipples' surgery for carcinoma of perimpullary region by Dr. Manubhai Pipalia and his team successfully. Patient started on full diet and recovering well.

2 Young Boys with Neck Swellings


Case 1 : A 17-year boy presented with complaint of recurrent painless parotid, submandibular and anterior neck swellings since 3 years. They were multiple soft, fluctuant, non tender swellings were palpable in bilateral retro auricular and parotid regions Past FNAC of the mass was reported reactive lymphadenitis.

Case 2 : A 21-year boy presented with a 12 years of recurrent head and neck swellings. In 2005 and 2012 he had painless left post auricular swellings. FNAC had shown mixed inflammatory infiltrate. He was



asymptomatic in between. Now presented with 1 year history of persistent swelling in bilateral posterior cervical and retro auricular regions. They were soft fluctuant swellings in both retro auricular regions were

palpable. In both: Routine investigations were normal; but eosinophilia of 20% was noticeable. CXR, viral serology, ANA(IF) and ANCA(IF) were negative. Both responded to steroids. But flared on stopping or tapering steroids. We ordered an excisional biopsy; which showed germinal center formation with follicular hyperplasia, eosinophilic infiltrate and eosinophilic abscesses. No vasculitis, necrosis, granuloma or malignancy features were seen. The r e were no systemic features, lymphoma, infectious symptoms, CTD features or atopy, allergies or asthma. The diagnosis was consistent with K i m u r a d i s e a s e . Both were started on 0.5 mg/kg Prednisolone and Methotrexate 15 mg. At 6 months first patient is in



remission and second is well on first follow up.

Discussion: Kimura disease is a chronic inflammatory disorder presenting as painless lymphadenopathy or subcutaneous masses in the head and neck region. Most cases are seen in Asia, between 20-30 years with a male predominance. Biopsy is characteristic and necessary for diagnosis. Treatment is immuno-suppression. Various agents are effective.

Conclusions: In our setting, this etiology should be entertained in young patients with unexplained masses in head and neck.
